Neighborhood House Community Center is located in the Greenbush neighborhood of Madison, Wisconsin.

In 1916, an undergraduate thesis by a University of Wisconsin student proposed the creation of an organization to meet the needs of a growing number of immigrant families in the Greenbush area. That organization became the first, and remains the oldest, community center in Madison: Neighborhood House.

Neighborhood House continues its long tradition of serving the community through its essential services, programming for all ages, and outreach.
